<sup>9</sup> On this day, B and C Squadrons and the Service Squadron of the 6<sup>th</sup> (Inniskilling) Dragoons from the 36<sup>th</sup> Division become the 2<sup>nd</sup> North Irish Horse at Toutencourt as the X Corps Cavalry Regiment. The Regiment is attached to the 36<sup>th</sup> (Ulster) Division. The 36<sup>th</sup> (Ulster) Division comprised the 107<sup>th</sup> Brigade (8, 9, 10 and 15 Royal Irish Rifles [East, West, South and North Belfast Volunteers]), the 108<sup>th</sup> Brigade (11, 12, 13 Royal Irish Rifles, 9 Royal Irish Fusiliers [South Antrim, Central Antrim, Down, and County Armagh Volunteers]), and the 109<sup>th</sup> Brigade (9, 10, 11 Royal Inniskilling Fusiliers [Tyrone, Derry, Donegal and Fermanagh Volunteers], 14 Royal Irish Rifles [Young Citizens Volunteers of Belfast]). On 27 April 1915 the Division was allocated to the Fifth New Army. In July the Division left Ireland and concentrated at Seaford. On 26 September it began its move to France and by 9 October concentration was completed around Flesselles.
